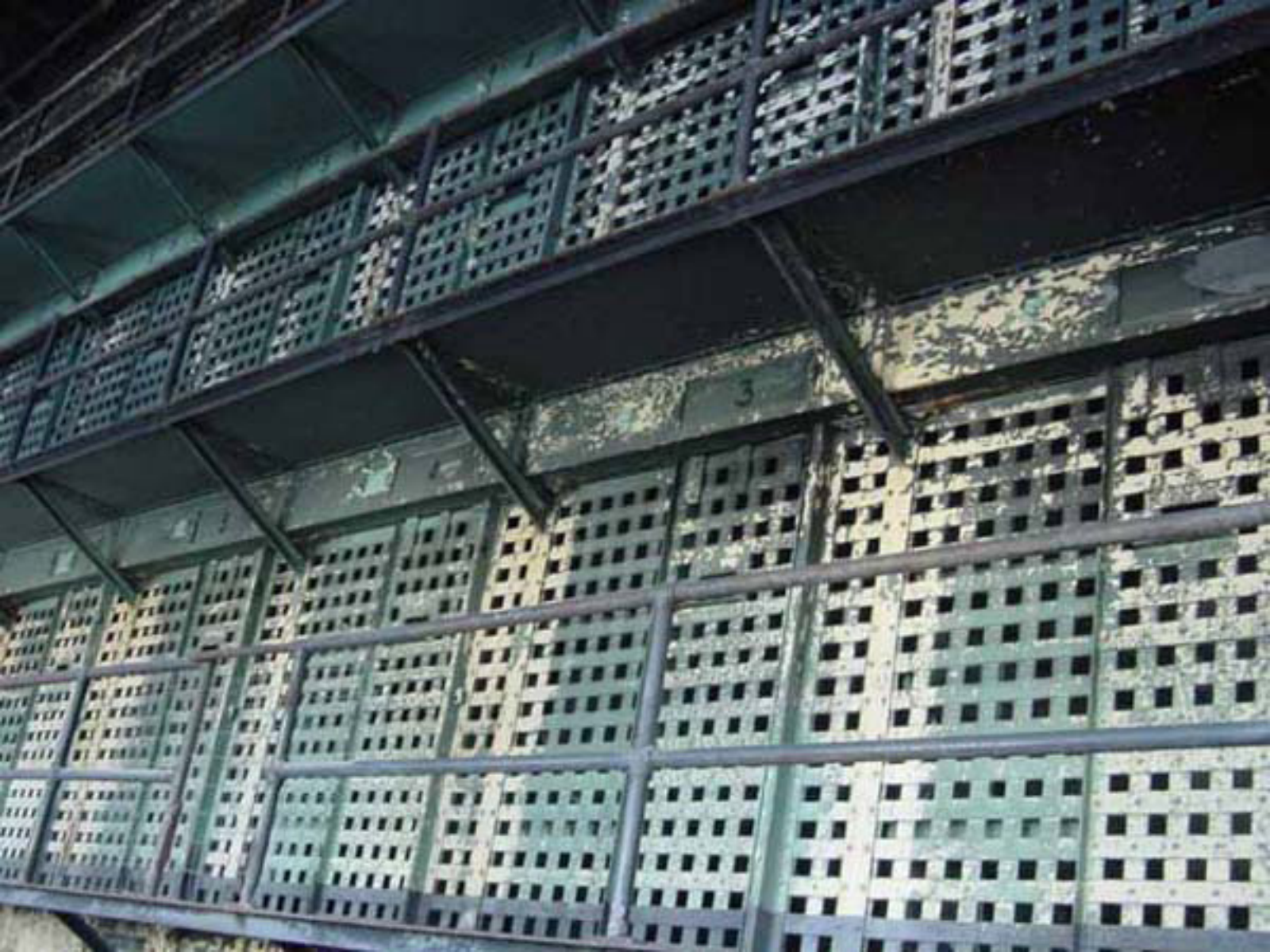




## 1950s CELLHOUSE

## DEATH ROW

A prisoner sentenced to death occupied a cell on Death Row while awaiting his execution date.

The only man to be hanged on the adjoining gallows spent a year on Death Row in 1957.

## THE DEATH PENALTY

The condemned man stood on the trap door. His hands and feet were bound; the noose suspended from above was placed around his neck. A paid executioner pulled the lever, opening the trap door. The prisoner was pronounced dead minutes after the drop.

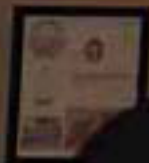
