There are several options to consider. Briefly, they are to continue our yearly reunions with help from professional planners; go to a regional mini-reunion - structure similar to the spring San Diego reunion; try to associate with some of our sister ships; or as recently suggested by Chuck Bussell, to join the yearly reunions planned and hosted by the Tin Can Sailor's Association.

## USS Floyd B Parks DD884 Navy Reunion in New Orleans, LA September 12 – 16, 2019

#### We are pleased to announce our stay will be at the Boomtown Casino & Hotel

4132 Peters Road, Harvey, LA 70058, approximately 15minutes or 12 miles from downtown New Orleans on the Harvey Canal. <u>www.boomtownneworleans.com</u>

Amenities include Guest room Wi-Fi, Coffee maker & bottled water, mini fridge, hot coffee in lobby 24 hours a day, free hotel parking for cars & motorhomes, handicap accessible rooms.

Blocked rooms are under the name **RFLOYDB Navy Reunion**. Reservations can be made by calling 855-805-5596. Check in time 4pm and Check out is 11am. All reservations for arrival after 6pm must be guaranteed with a major credit card. They will not hold any reservations after 6pm unless secured by credit card.

We have tried to obtain transportation from the airport and have had no luck. You will need to set up your own transportation from the airport. It has been suggested to use taxi service or Uber.

# Please note: we need to move up the date for <u>final reservations</u> which will now be <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>July</u> <u>31<sup>st</sup></u> in order to reduce the number of rooms we have blocked.

Reservations must be accompanied by a first night room deposit or guaranteed with a major credit card. **The cancellation policy is 24 hours prior to arrival.** A limited amount of rooms will be available at group rate 3 days prior and 3 days following.

King/Queen room rate weekday \$99. (Sunday is considered a weekday)

King/Queen room rate Friday/Saturday \$129.00

Rate + tax per night + Amenity fee per night \$9.99 (Triple & Quad rates are \$20 more per guest per night)

Complimentary breakfast vouchers per guest (one each morning) based only on single & double occupied rooms. Must pay the triple & quad rate to receive additional breakfast vouchers. Food credit of \$5.00 is applied to the reservation to deduct from charges of food or beverage to the guest room. Credit is applicable to the restaurants Bayou Market, BMX and Asia restaurant on property.


I have a name for the taps list I did not want to see. Any ship mate we lose will forever be missed but Robby had a very special place in our lives. Two names is all I have for the taps list.
